

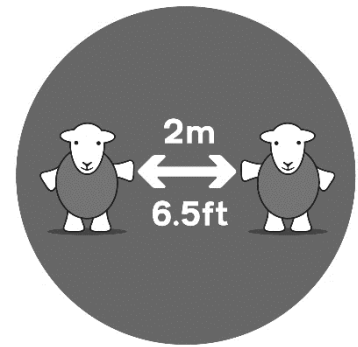
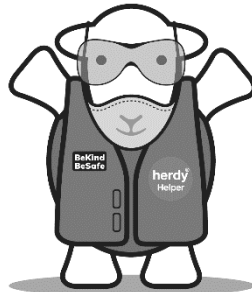

Welcome to church! Here are our notices for this week:

- Thank you to our organ scholar **Thomas Morton** for playing the organ today!
- This month is **Barlborough's 3rd Annual Scarecrow Festival** – join in by adding a scarecrow to your house grounds!
- **Saturday 15th August is the 75th Anniversary of Victory in Japan (VJ Day)**. There will be a short act of remembrance in the memorial garden in Barlborough at 11am (this will be streamed on our Facebook page). People are encouraged to have socially distanced afternoon tea parties with their neighbours at 2pm to celebrate. Bunting will also be put up around church.



- You'll see there is a **new layout**, we have a one way system around the church and every other pew is closed. Please pay attention to the floor markings.
- Please wear a **face covering** (unless you have a medical exemption) when in church to protect yourself and those around you. This is now a mandatory requirement.
- There will be **no singing**, sadly, but please do join in with the words in bold in this order of service as usual.
- We will share the **peace** at a distance!
- Come up to receive **communion** when prompted, communion will be in one kind only (the bread). If you would rather not receive communion you can still come up for a blessing – bring this sheet with you. When you reach the front of the line you can remove your mask for receiving communion and then replace afterwards. Take your time for your special moment with God.

GOSPEL READING

Please stand and face the Gospel reader.

Alleluia, alleluia.

We do not live by bread alone,
but by every word that comes from the mouth of God. **Alleluia.**

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew.

Glory to you, O Lord.

22 Immediately he made the disciples get into the boat and go on ahead to the other side, while he dismissed the crowds. ²³And after he had dismissed the crowds, he went up the mountain by himself to pray. When evening came, he was there alone, ²⁴but by this time the boat, battered by the waves, was far from

the land, for the wind was against them. ²⁵And early in the morning he came walking towards them on the lake. ²⁶But when the disciples saw him walking on the lake, they were terrified, saying, 'It is a ghost!' And they cried out in fear. ²⁷But immediately Jesus spoke to them and said, 'Take heart, it is I; do not be afraid.'

28 Peter answered him, 'Lord, if it is you, command me to come to you on the water.' ²⁹He said, 'Come.' So Peter got out of the boat, started walking on the water, and came towards Jesus. ³⁰But when he noticed the strong wind, he became frightened, and beginning to sink, he cried out, 'Lord, save me!' ³¹Jesus immediately reached out his hand and caught him, saying to him, 'You of little faith, why did you doubt?' ³²When they got into the boat, the wind ceased. ³³And those in the boat worshipped him, saying, 'Truly you are the Son of God.'
